



Douglas R. Porter, FAICP, is President of the Growth Management Institute. He is one of the nation's leading authorities on managing community and regional growth. In consulting and writing, and through the nonprofit Growth Management Institute (which he founded in 1992), he conducts research and engages in educational activities. His work spans the spectrum from affordable housing programs to transportation/land use relationships, regional growth management, transit-oriented development, and local community development issues. From 1979 to 1991, Porter directed the public policy research program of the Urban Land Institute. He is an AICP Fellow and received a B.S. in Urban and Regional Planning from Michigan State University and an M.S. in the same subject from the University of Illinois.
