

## Chapter 13. Income, Public Assistance and Educational Attainment

The median annual income of New York City households averaged \$39,000 per year in 2002, according to data from the New York City Housing and Vacancy Survey (HVS)<sup>1</sup> (Borough Table 13-1).

Borough Table 13-1 shows the different median household incomes for each borough in 2002. While median household income in the Bronx and Brooklyn was relatively low (\$26,000 and \$33,800, respectively), income was relatively high in Manhattan, Queens and Staten Island (\$48,400, \$44,000 and \$53,000, respectively). It is important to note that the 1999 income data

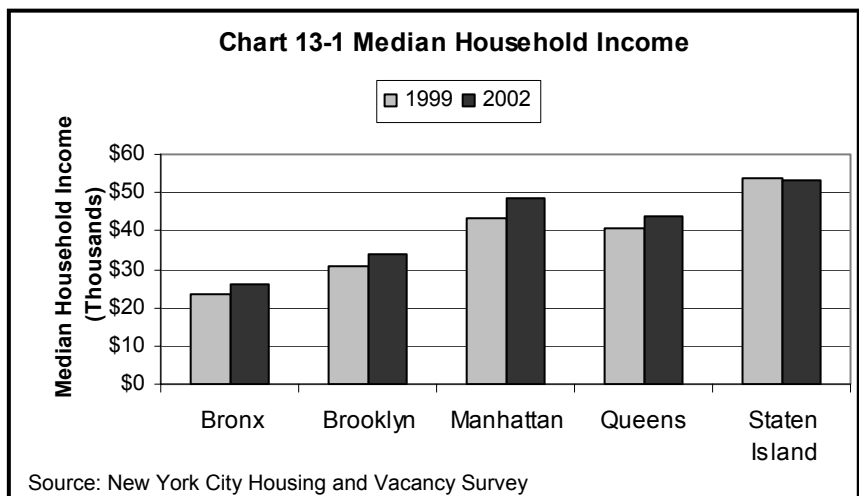

have been adjusted for inflation, and thus the change is expressed in real dollars. Because the HVS employed a different sampling frame in 2002 from the one it used in 1999, caution should be used when comparing income across years. Nevertheless, the data suggest that, for the city as a whole, median income increased by about 9.8% between 1999 and 2002. Looking at changes in median income across boroughs, income increased in all boroughs, except for Staten Island where income decreased slightly (by 1.5%). The highest income increase was in Manhattan (12.4%). (Note that 1999 income has been adjusted for inflation.)

According to the 2002 HVS, the highest household incomes occurred mainly in Manhattan: Upper East Side (\$79,700), Greenwich Village/Financial District (\$77,000), Stuyvesant Town/Turtle Bay (\$72,000), and Upper West Side (\$71,200). Although relatively lower, Queens' Bay-

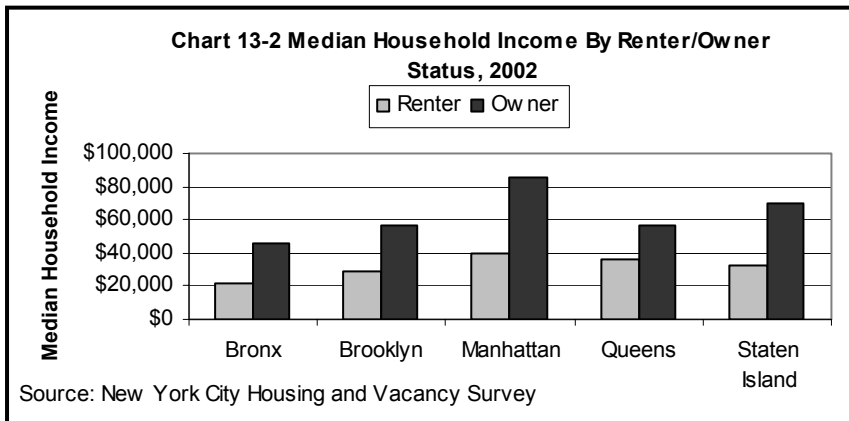

side/Little Neck and Staten Island's South Shore both demonstrated some of the highest household incomes (\$60,000 each). At the other end of the spectrum, the lowest median household incomes occurred mainly in the Bronx: Morrisania/Belmont (\$14,000), Mott Haven/Hunts Point (\$15,000), University Heights/Fordham (\$20,800), and Highbridge/South Concourse (\$21,050). East Harlem in Manhattan also had a relatively low median household income (\$18,000). (Ex-hibit 13-1).

Looking at renter versus owner median household income across the boroughs, the owner median household income is consistently higher than the renter income. In total, the owner median household income is \$60,000 per year, whereas the renter median household income is \$31,000. The Bronx exhibits the lowest renter and owner median household incomes

(\$22,000 and \$45,500, respectively). While Manhattan's renter median household income is the highest among the boroughs (\$40,000), it is similar to the owner median income in the Bronx. Manhattan's owner median household income (\$86,000) is also the highest among the owner households in the boroughs (Borough Table 13-2).

In addition to income, the HVS also provides data on poverty in New York City. The HVS

data indicate that 17.5 percent of households in New York City were poor in 2002. The poverty rate was highest in the Bronx (26.6%), followed by Brooklyn (20.5%), Manhattan (16.2%), Queens (11.2%), and Staten Island (11.0%) (Borough Table 13-3).

Poverty rates vary even more widely across sub-borough areas. As shown in Exhibit 13-2, the Bronx has the most neighborhoods with the highest percentage of households below the poverty line: Morrisana/Belmont (45.6% live below the poverty line), Mott Haven/Hunts Point (44.6%), University Heights/ Fordham (35.9%), and Kingsbridge Heights/Mosholu (33.7%). Brooklyn's Bushwick also exhibits extremely high levels of poverty (33.6%). Very low poverty rates are observed in Bayside/Little Neck in Queens (4.4%), the Upper East Side in Manhattan (5.1%), Queens Village in Queens (5.1%), South Shore in Staten Island (7.2%), and South Ozone Park/Howard Beach in Queens (8.3%).

In 2002, 11.8% of households in New York City received some form of public assistance. The Bronx exhibits the highest public assistance rate (21.3%) and Staten Island has the lowest rate (6.4%). Brooklyn, Manhattan, and Queens demonstrated mid-range public assistance rates, with 14.6%, 8.3%, and

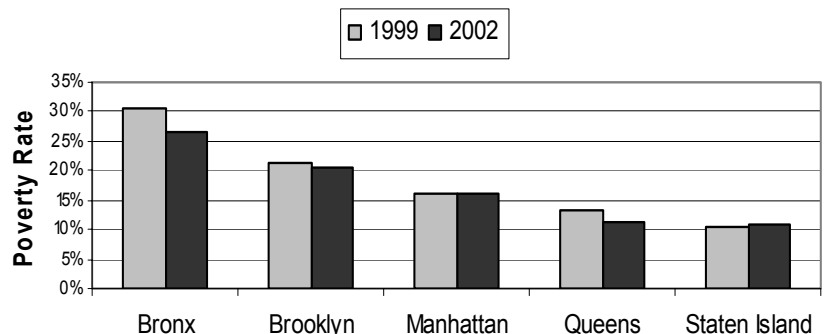

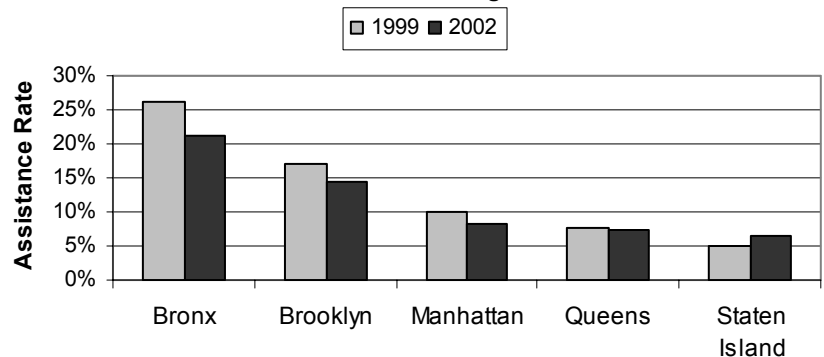

7.2%, respectively (Borough Table 13-4).

Exhibit 13-3 shows that among sub-borough areas, in 2002 the highest public assistance rates were observed in the Bronx: Mott Haven/Hunts Point (36.7%), Morrisania /Belmont (36.5%), University Heights /Fordham (35.0%), and Highbridge/South Concourse (29.5%). Manhattan's East Harlem also had a high rate of public assistance, at 26.8%. The lowest rates of public assistance were found in Manhattan's Upper East Side (2.0%), Greenwich Village/Financial District (2.6%), and Stuyvesant Town/Turtle Bay (3.5%), Bayside/Little Neck in Queens (3.7%), and Staten Island's South Shore (3.7%).

Turning to educational attainment, in 2000, 27.7% of all people over the age of 25 in New York City had not obtained a high school diploma. The highest proportion of adults over 25 without a high school diploma lived in the Bronx (37.7%). Brooklyn had the next highest percentage at 31.2%, followed by Queens (25.6%), Manhattan (21.3%), and Staten Island (17.4%) (Borough Table 13-5).

The highest and lowest percentage of people over the age of 25 with less than a high school diploma can be categorized by race and sub-borough area. In 2000, the highest percentages of Whites with less than a high school diploma were present in neighborhoods in the Bronx and Brooklyn, and the lowest percentages were found in Manhattan sub-borough areas (Exhibit 13-4). As for Blacks with less than a high school diploma, the highest percent-

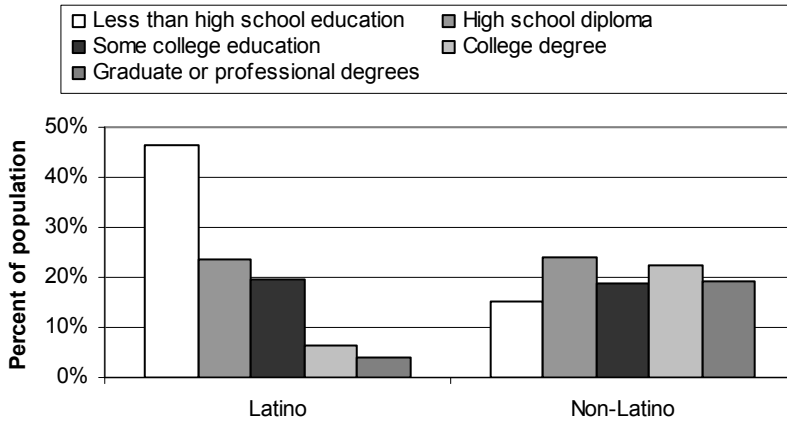

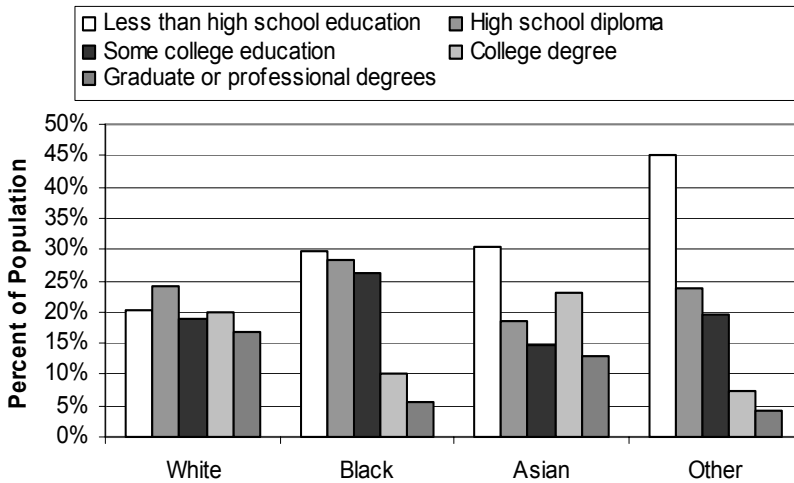

ages were scattered among the Bronx, Staten Island, Queens and Brooklyn. The lowest percentages of Blacks with less than a high school diploma were also found in sub-boroughs of Queens and Brooklyn, as well as Manhattan (Exhibit 13-5). The highest percentages of Asians with less than a high school education were in sub-boroughs of Manhattan, Brooklyn and the Bronx. The lowest percentage of Asians with less than a high school diploma predominantly occurred in Manhattan sub-boroughs, with one low percentage rate in a Staten Island sub-borough area (Exhibit 13-6). Similar to Whites, Latinos exhibited the highest percentages of people with less than a high school diploma in Bronx and Brooklyn sub-borough areas. The lowest percentages of Latinos with less than a high school diploma were in neighborhoods in Staten Island, Queens and Manhattan (Exhibit 13-7).

In 2000, 24.4% of residents over 25 years of age in New York City attained, as their highest level of education, a high school diploma or GED. The percentage of people with some college or an associate's degree was 20.4%. College degrees were obtained at a rate of 15.8%. Finally, the percentage of people over 25 with a graduate degree was 11.6% in 2000. The highest proportion of all adults with graduate degrees was in Manhattan (23.4%) and the lowest proportion was in the Bronx (5.9%) (Borough Table 13-5).

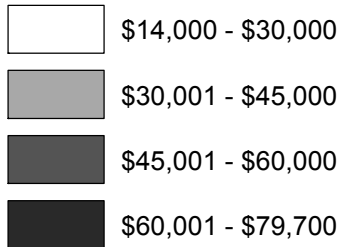

# Map 13-1 Median Household Income in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

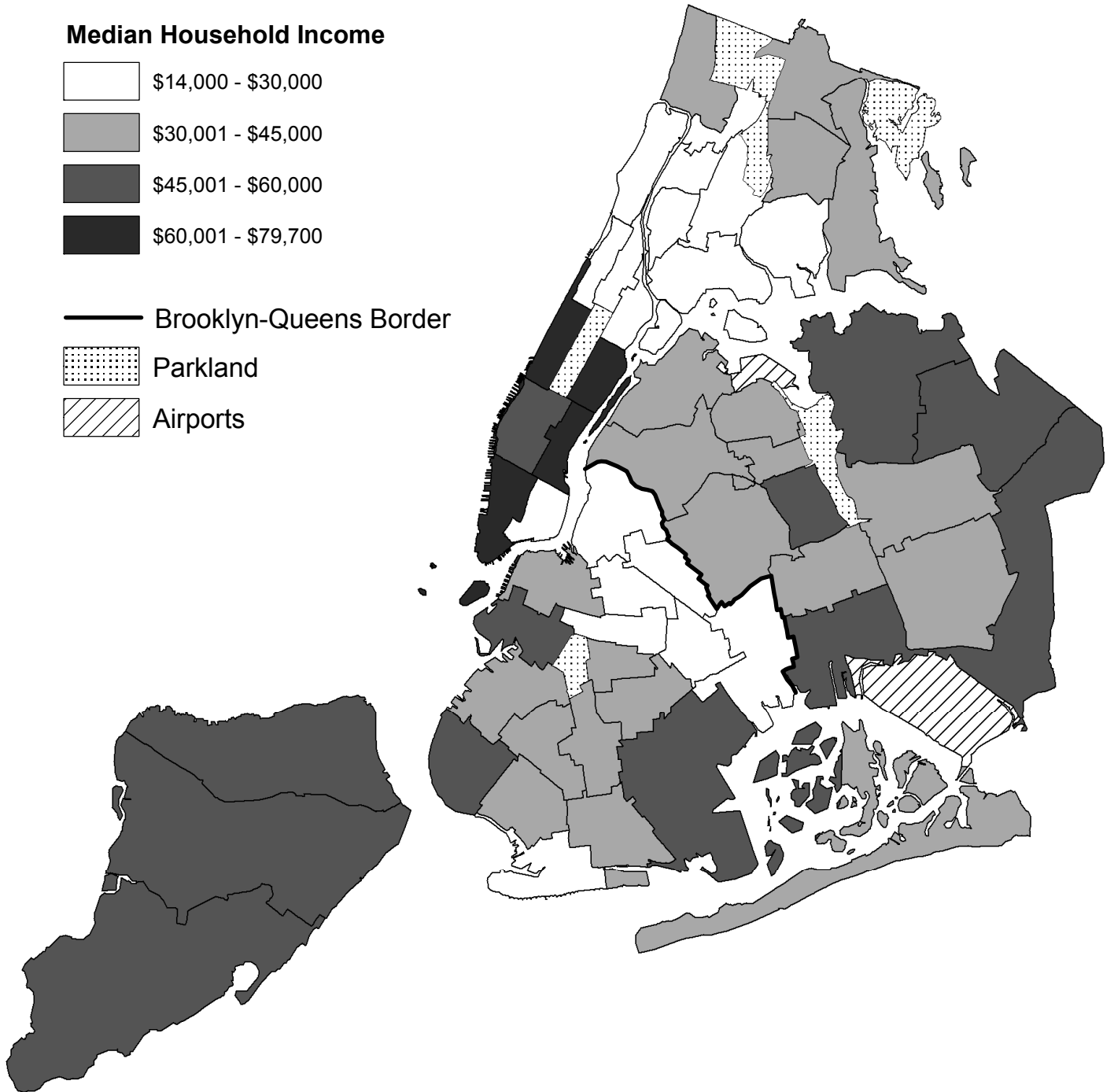

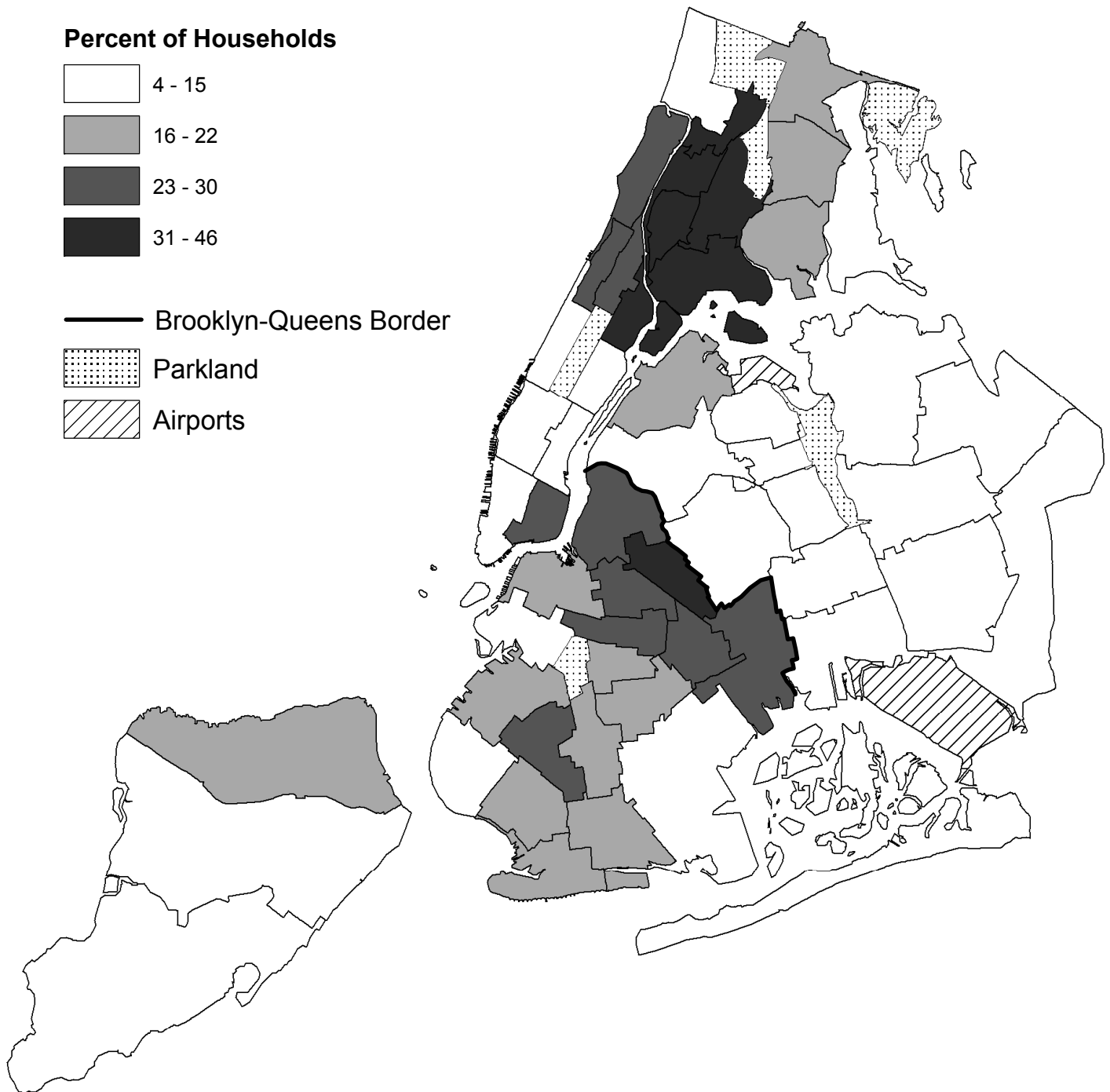

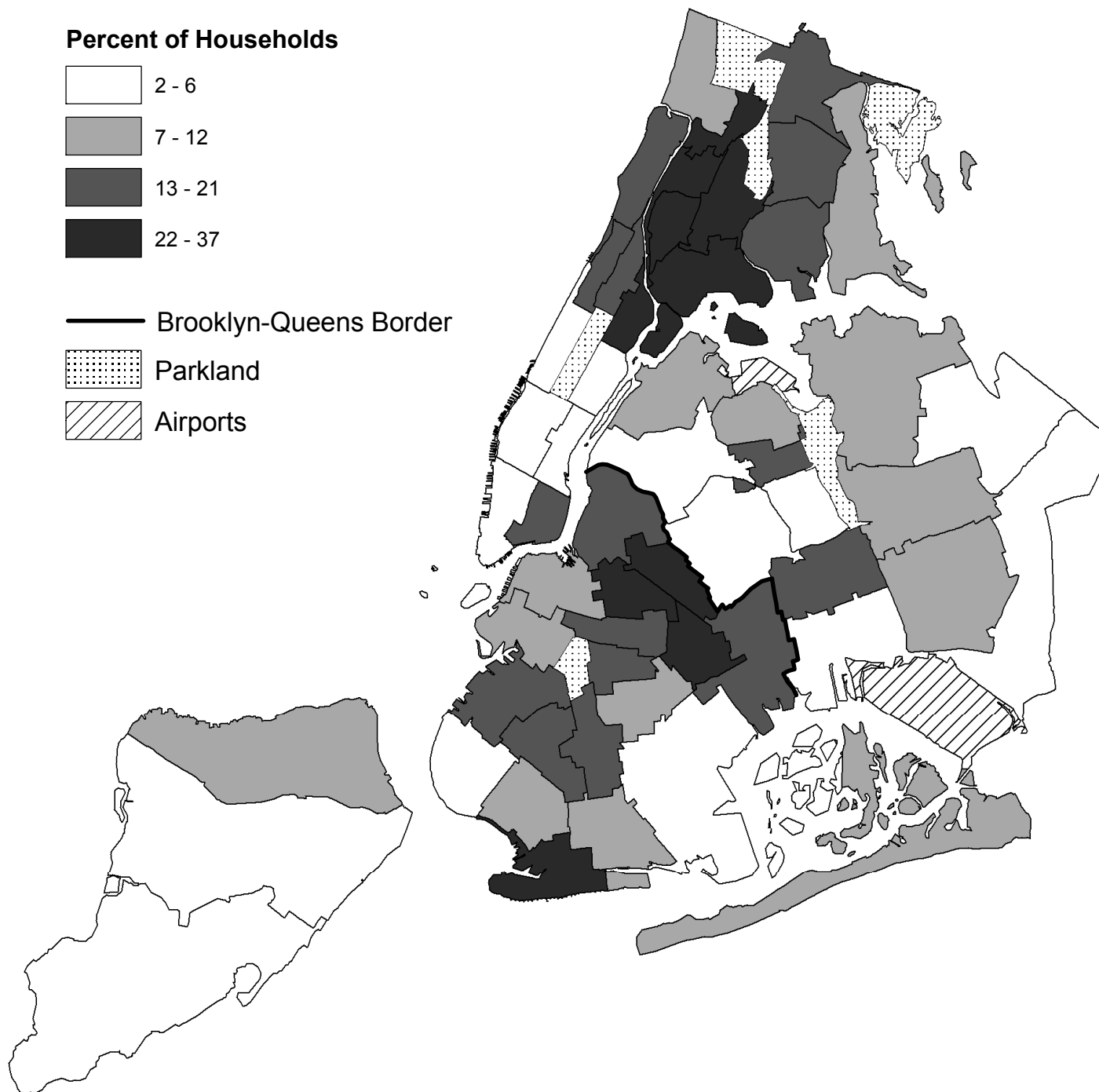

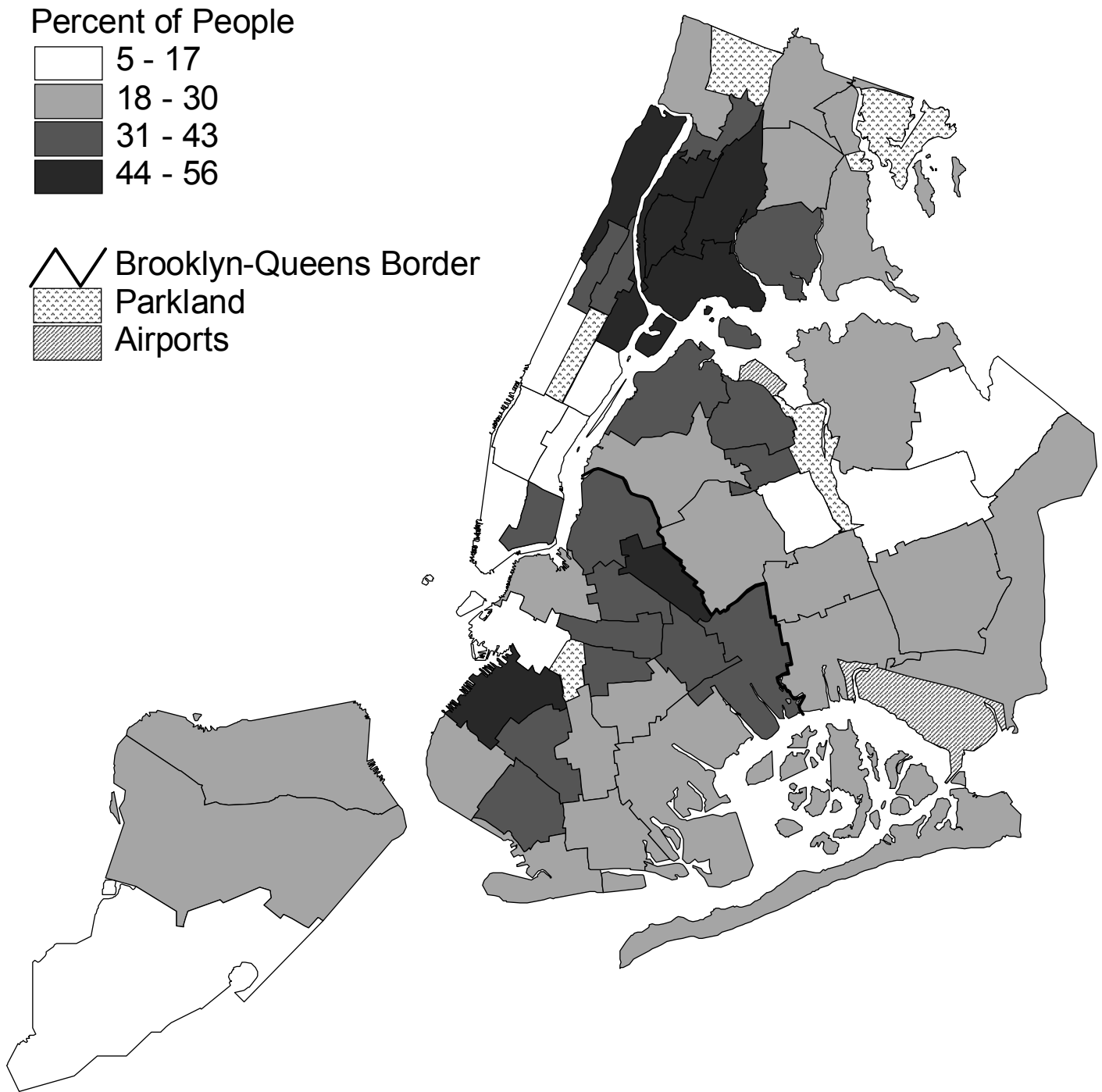

## Percent of People Over 25 with Less than a High School Education, New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2000

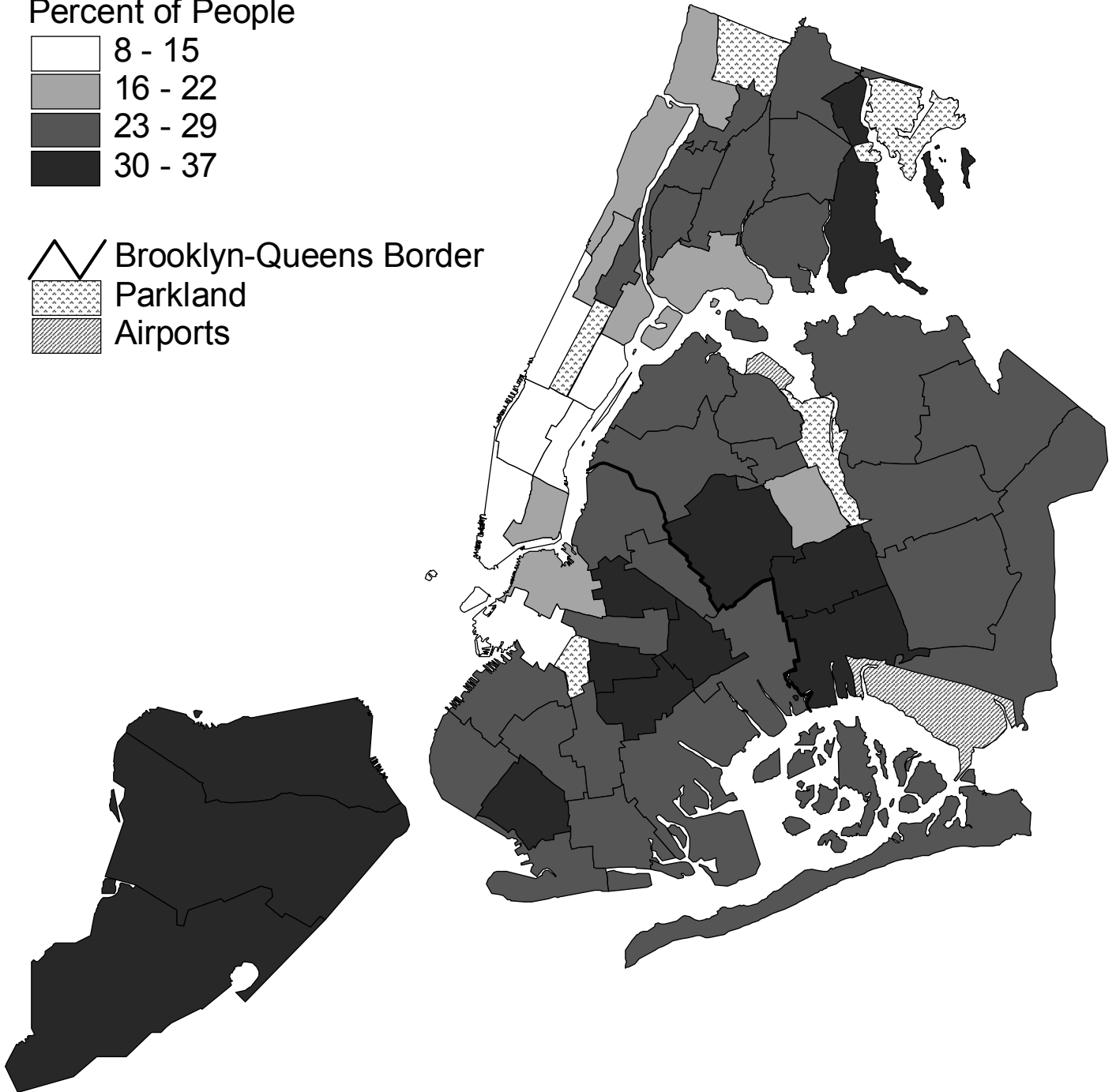

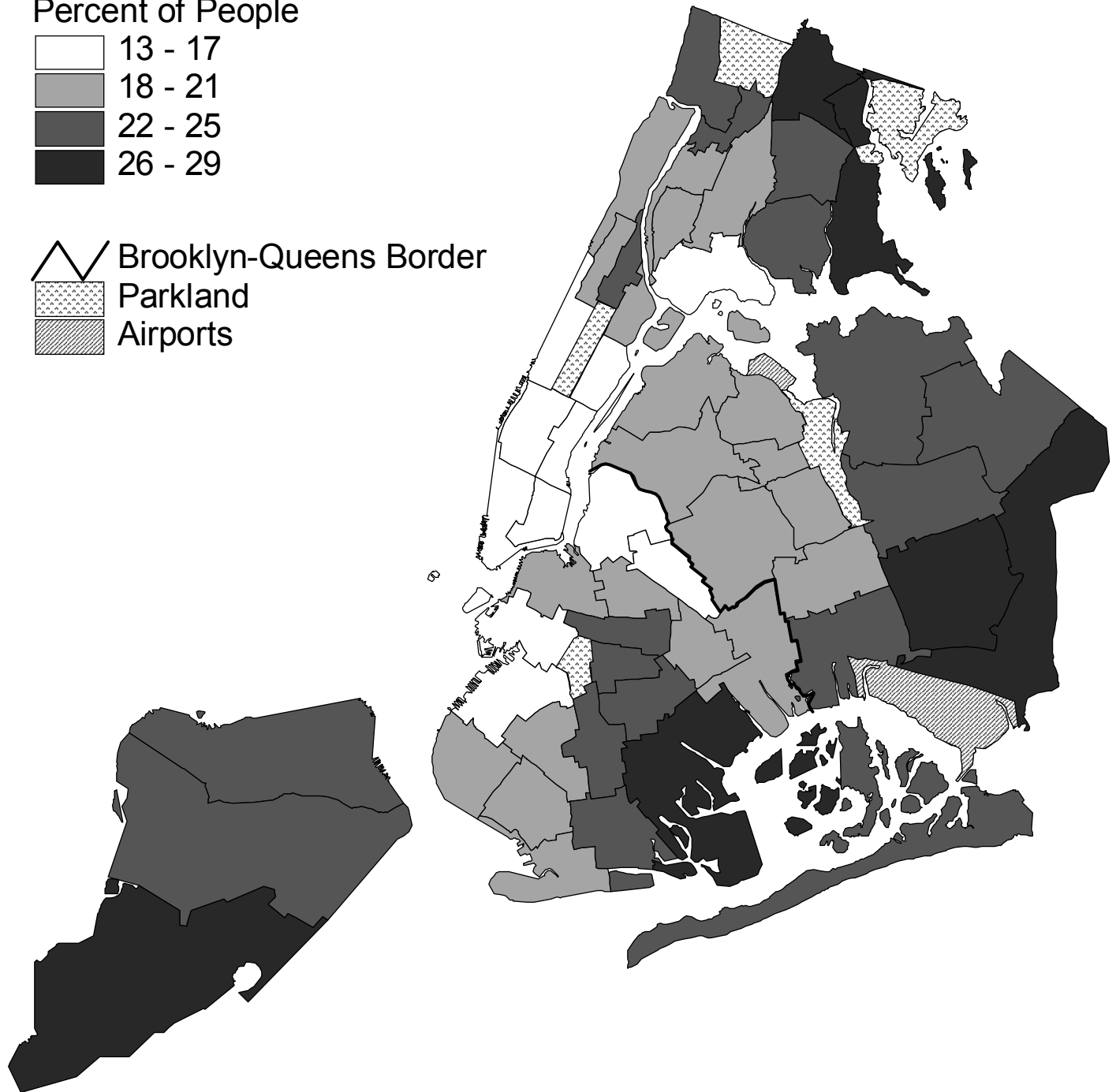
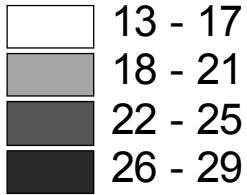

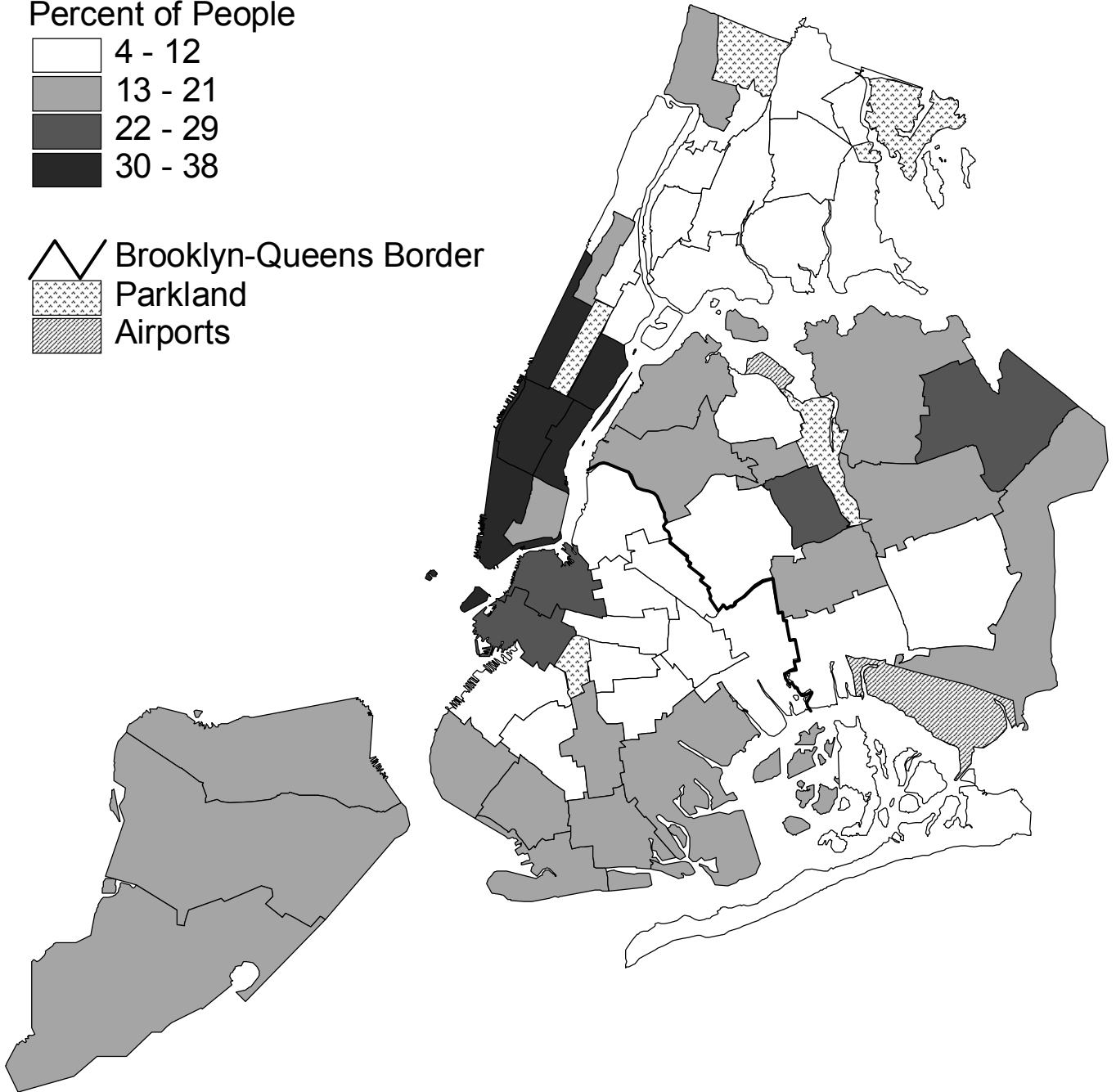
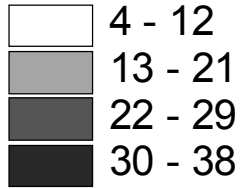

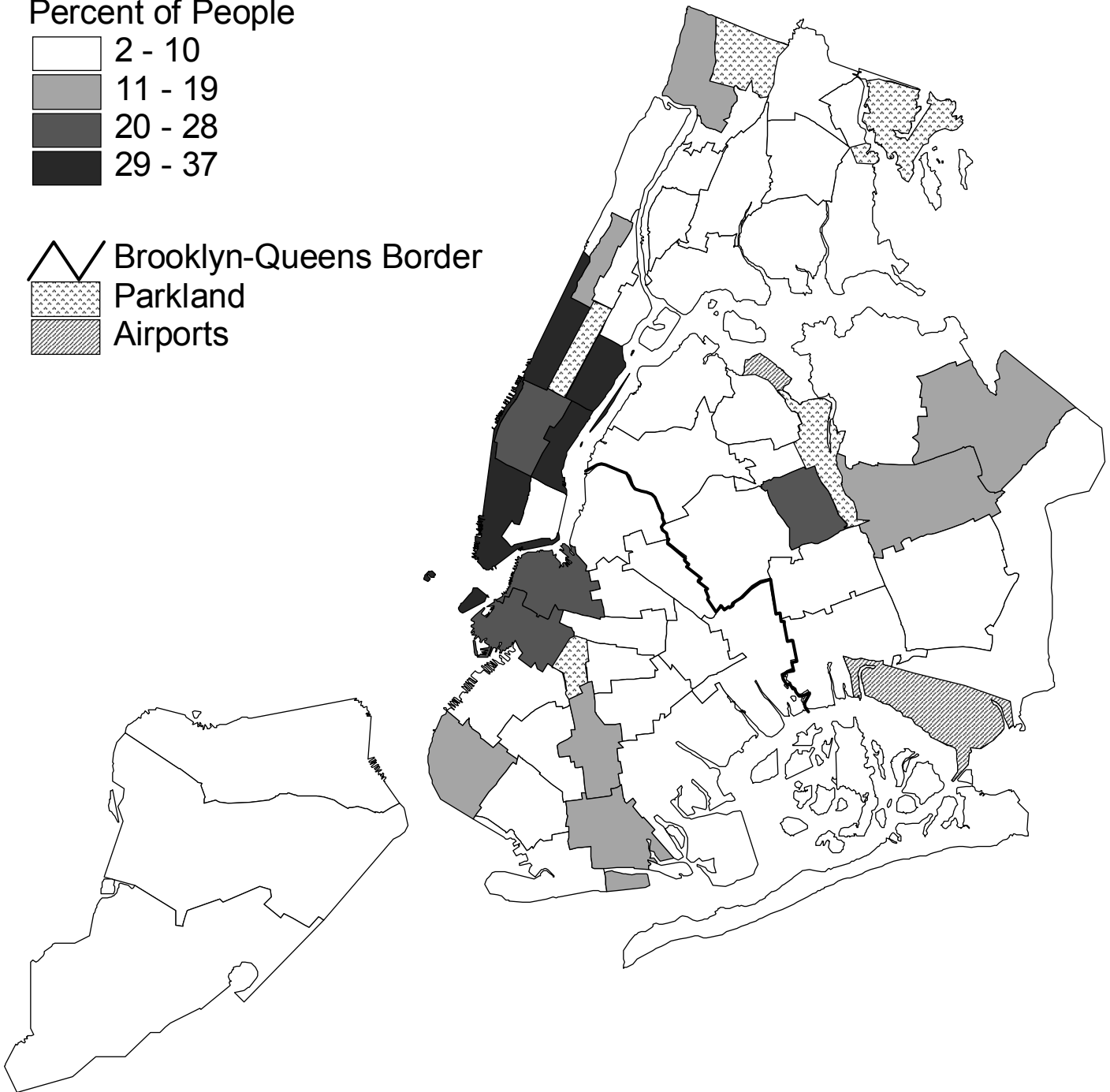
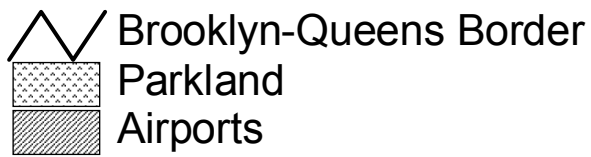
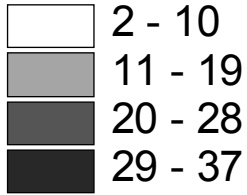
