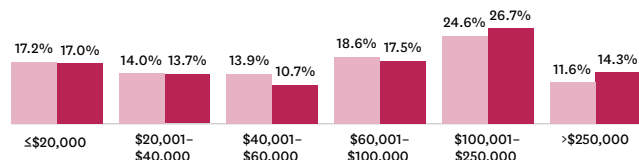

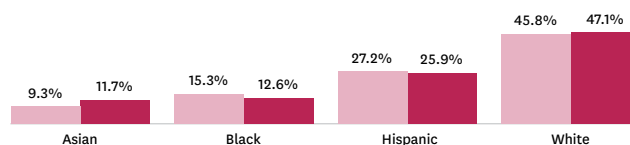
Household Income Distribution (\$2017)
